#### ORDINANCE NO. 2024-13

AN ORDINANCE OF THE VILLAGE OF SALADO ADOPTING THE FISCAL YEAR 2024-2025 ANNUAL OPERATING BUDGET FOR THE VILLAGE OF SALADO, TEXAS; DECLARING FINDINGS OF FACT; PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE; PROVIDING A SEVERABILITY CLAUSE; AND PROVIDING AN OPEN MEETINGS CLAUSE.

WHEREAS, the Board of Aldermen of the Village of Salado, Texas (the "Village") recognize the need for a budget and to be in compliance with the Local Government Code Sec. 102.002 of The State of Texas directing municipalities to create a fiscal year budget; and

WHEREAS, the Village of Salado Board of Aldermen have diligently researched each line item of revenue and expense to prepare a budget felt to adequately guide the Village's finances for the Fiscal Year beginning October 1, 2024, and ending September 30, 2025; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Aldermen held a public hearing on the proposed Fiscal Year 2024-2025 Budget on August 22, 2024, as required by law and after considering the comments of the public at such public hearing, the Board of Aldermen desire to adopt the budget for the Fiscal Year 2025; and

**NOW THEREFORE**, be it ordained by the Board of Aldermen of the Village of Salado, County of Bell, State of Texas, that:

#### 1. FINDINGS OF FACT

- Part 1: The facts and recitations set forth in the preamble of this Ordinance are hereby found to be true and correct.
- Part 2: The public hearing on the budget was held at 6:30 p.m. on August 22, 2024, in the Village of Salado Municipal Building.
- Part 3: The budget for the Village of Salado for the fiscal year beginning October 1, 2024, and ending September 30, 2025, together with the changes and amendments adopted by the Board of Aldermen, is on file in the Office of the City Secretary and posted on the Village's website.

#### 2. ENACTMENT

The budget for Fiscal Year 2024-2025, which is attached hereto and incorporated into this Ordinance for all intents and purposes, which includes the appropriations and property tax rates for the 2024-25 fiscal year, shall be and thereby be adopted for the support of the general government of the Village.

#### 3. SEVERABILITY

Should any of the clauses, sentences, paragraphs, sections or parts of this Ordinance be deemed invalid, unconstitutional, or unenforceable by a court of law or administrative agency with jurisdiction over the matter, such action shall not be construed to affect any other valid portion of this Ordinance.

#### 4. FILING OF THE BUDGET

The City Secretary is hereby directed to file the budget on the website of the Village and in the Village's official records as well as with the Bell County Clerk.

#### 5. EFFECTIVE DATE

This Ordinance shall be effective immediately upon passage.

#### 6. PROPER NOTICE AND MEETING

It is hereby officially found and determined that the meeting at which this Ordinance was passed was open to the public, and that public notice of the time, place and purpose of said meeting was given as required by the Open Meetings Act, Texas Government Code, Chapter 551. Notice was also provided as required by Chapter 52 of the Texas Local Government Code.

This budget will raise more total property taxes than last year's budget by \$604,467 or 48.47%, and of that amount \$205,031.98 is tax revenue to be raised from new property added to the tax roll this year.

A property tax rate of \$0.4860 per \$100 is proposed to fund the proposed Fiscal Year 2025 Budget.

#### ORDINANCE NO. 2024-14

AN ORDINANCE OF THE VILLAGE OF SALADO, TEXAS, SETTING A PROPERTY (AD VALOREM) TAX RATE; APPROVING THE AD VALOREM TAX RATE AND LEVY OF \$0.4860 PER ONE HUNDRED DOLLARS (\$100) OF ASSESSED VALUATION OF ALL TAXABLE PROPERTY WITHIN THE CORPORATE LIMITS OF THE VILLAGE FOR THE 2024 TAX YEAR TO FUND THE FISCAL YEAR 2024-2025 OPERATING BUDGET FOR THE VILLAGE OF SALADO; PROVIDING FOR AN EXEMPTION ON RESIDENCE HOMESTEADS: PROVIDING FOR EXEMPTIONS FOR INDIVIDUALS WHO ARE DISABLED OR 65 YEARS OF AGE OR OLDER; PROVIDING FOR PENALTIES AND INTEREST: PROVIDING FOR SEVERABILITY; PROVIDING FOR REPEALING CONFLICT; PROVIDING FOR PROPER NOTICE AND **MEETING: PROVIDING** ENGROSSMENT AND ENROLLMENT; PROVIDING FOR NOTIFICATION TO ASSESSOR: AND PROVIDING FOR PUBLICATION AND EFFECTIVE DATE.

- WHEREAS, the Village of Salado, Texas (the "Village") is responsible for the maintenance and repair of the streets within corporate boundaries of the Village; and
- WHEREAS, pursuant to the Texas Constitution and Texas Property Tax Code, a general-law municipality such as Village of Salado has the authority to establish, enact and collect property taxes; and
- WHEREAS, the appraisal rolls of the Village for 2024 have been prepared and certified by the Bell Central Appraisal District and submitted to the Village's tax assessor/collector; and
- **WHEREAS,** Texas Tax Code Section 26.05 requires that the Village adopt a tax rate for the current tax year and shall notify the assessor for the unit of the rate adopted; and
- WHEREAS, the Board of Aldermen finds that a tax rate of \$0.4860 cents per one hundred dollars (\$100) of assessed valuation of all taxable property within the corporate limits of Salado is reasonable and prudent to provide the tax revenues required by the Village; and

WHEREAS, a budget appropriating revenues generated for the use and support of the municipal government of the Village of Salado has been approved and adopted by the Village of Salado Board of Aldermen as required by Section 102.009 of the Texas Local Government Code; and

WHEREAS, a notice of the hearing on a proposed tax rate was published in the Village's official newspaper on August 15,2024; and

**WHEREAS**, it is necessary to levy such an ad valorem tax at a given rate to generate revenues sufficient to meet the projected expenses of the Village for fiscal year 2024-2025.

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED** by the Board of Aldermen of the Village of Salado, Texas:

#### Section 1. Findings of Fact

The above Findings of Fact shall be incorporated herein as Legislative findings of the Board of Aldermen

### Section 2. Approval of Fiscal Year 2024-25 Tax Rate and Levy

That there be and is hereby levied and shall be assessed and collected for the 2024-25 fiscal year on all taxable property, real, personal and mixed, situated within the city limits of the Village of Salado, Texas, and not exempt by the Constitution of the State and valid state laws, an ad valorem tax rate of \$0.4860 cents on each One Hundred Dollars (\$ 100.00) assessed value of taxable property, and shall be apportioned and distributed as follows:

- (a) For the purpose of defraying the current expenses and budget of the municipal government of the Village (Maintenance and Operation), a tax rate of \$0.3019 cents on each One Hundred Dollars (\$100.00) assessed value of taxable property.
- (b) For the payment of Principal and Interest on Bonds and other debt of the City, a tax rate of \$0.1841 cents on each One Hundred Dollars (\$100.00) assessed value of taxable property.

TOTAL TAX RATE OF \$0.4860 CENTS.

THIS TAX RATE WILL RAISE MORE TAXES FOR MAINTENANCE AND OPERATIONS THAN LAST YEAR'S TAX RATE. THE TAX RATE WILL EFFECTIVELY BE RAISED BY 61.44% PERCENT AND WILL RAISE TAXES FOR MAINTENANCE AND OPERATIONS ON A \$100,000 HOME BY APPROXIMATELY \$114.90.

(c) The City Secretary shall cause the following notice to be posted on the homepage of the Village's internet website:

THE VILLAGE OF SALADO ADOPTED A TAX RATE THAT WILL RAISE MORE TAXES FOR MAINTENANCE AND OPERATIONS THAN LAST YEAR'S TAX RATE. THE TAX RATE WILL EFFECTIVELY BE RAISED BY 61.44% PERCENT AND WILL RAISE TAXES FOR MAINTENANCE AND OPERATIONS ON A \$100.000 HOME BY APPROXIMATELY \$114.90.

#### **Section 3. Exemptions and Tax Freeze**

The Homestead Exemptions and Tax Freeze previously ordained by the Board of Alderman remain in effect.

The Board of Aldermen, pursuant to Section 1-b, Article VIII of the Texas Constitution and Section 11.13(d) of the Texas Property Tax Code, has adopted an exemption on the residence homesteads of persons who are disabled or sixty-five (65) years of age or older. The person or entity performing the tax assessment and collection functions for the Village of Salado is authorized and instructed to implement the necessary procedures to exempt from taxation fifty thousand dollars (\$50,000.00) of the appraised value of the residence homestead.

The Board of Aldermen has adopted an exemption amounting to twenty percent (20%) of the appraised value. The exemption is granted to owner-occupied single-family residential units within the Village. The person or entity performing the tax assessment and collection functions for the Village of Salado is authorized and instructed to implement the necessary procedures to exempt from taxation twenty percent (20%) of the appraised value as provided above.

The Board of Aldermen, pursuant to Section 1-b(h), Article VIII of the Texas Constitution and Section 1 1.261 of the Texas Property Tax Code, previously adopted an ad valorem tax freeze on the residence homesteads of persons who are disabled or 65 years of age or older. The person or entity performing the tax assessment and collection functions for the Village of Salado is authorized to implement the necessary procedures to freeze the ad valorem taxes on the residence homesteads of persons who are disabled or 65 years of age or older, as provided for in Section 1-b(h), Article VIII of the Texas Constitution and Section 1 1.261 of the Texas Property Tax Code.

#### Section 4. Penalty and Interest

All taxes shall become a lien upon the property against which assessed and the Tax Assessor/Collector for the Village of Salado, Texas shall by virtue of the tax rolls, fix and establish a lien by levying upon such property, whether real or personal, for the payment of said taxes, penalty and interest, and the penalty and interest collected from such delinquent taxes shall be appropriated for the general fund of the Village of Salado, Texas.

If any provision, section, subsection, sentence, clause or phrase of this Ordinance, or the application of same to any person or set circumstances for any reason is held to be unconstitutional, void or invalid or for any reason unenforceable, the validity of the remaining portions of this ordinance of the application thereby shall remain in effect, it being the intent of the Board of Aldermen of the Village of Salado, Texas in adopting this ordinance, that no portion thereof or provision contained herein shall become inoperative or fail by any reason of unconstitutionality or invalidity of any portion or provision.

#### Section 6. Repealing Conflict

All ordinances and parts of ordinances in conflict with this Ordinance are hereby repealed to the extent of conflict with this Ordinance.

#### Section 7. Proper Notice and Meeting

It is hereby officially found and determined that the meeting at which this Ordinance was passed was open to the public, and that public notice of the time, place and purpose of said meeting was given as required by the Open Meetings Act. Texas Government Code, Chapter 551. Notice was also provided as required by Chapter 52 of the Texas Local Government Code.

#### Section 8. Engrossment & Enrollment

The City Secretary of the Village is hereby directed to engross and enroll this Ordinance by copying the caption, publication clause, penalty clause, and effective date clause in the minutes of the Board of Aldermen and by filing this Ordinance in the ordinance records of the Village.

#### Section 9. Notification to Assessor

The City Secretary of the Village is hereby directed to notify the tax assessor for the Village of the tax rate adopted.

#### Section 10. Publishing and Effective Date

This Ordinance shall become effective immediately upon publication. The City Secretary is hereby directed to publish in the Official newspaper of the Village of Salado, the caption, and effective date clause of this Ordinance as required by Section 52.011 of the Texas Local Government Code.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF ALDERMEN OF THE VILLAGE OF SALADO, TEXAS:

#### SECTION I. ENACTMENT PROVISIONS

WHEREAS, the Board of Aldermen (the "Board") of the Village seeks to ensure that utility service is adequate and efficient for the citizens of the Village; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Chapter 402 of the Texas Local Government Code and other laws, the Village is authorized to operate its utility systems inside or outside its municipal boundaries, to regulate the systems in a manner that protects the interests of the municipality, and to extend the lines of its utility systems inside and outside the municipal boundaries.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF ALDERMEN OF THE VILLAGE OF SALADO, TEXAS:

### SECTION I. ENACTMENT PROVISIONS

- **A. Findings of Fact:** All of the above premises are hereby found to be true and correct legislative and factual findings of the Village of Salado and are hereby approved and incorporated into the body of this ordinance as if copied in their entirety.
- **B. Popular Name:** This Ordinance shall be commonly referred to as "The Ordinance Establishing Utility service Terms and Conditions Outside of the Village Municipal Limits."
- **C. Scope:** This Ordinance, and the rules and regulations adopted herein, shall apply generally within the Village limits.

**D.** Effective Date: This Ordinance shall take effect immediately upon passage and publication.

### SECTION II. ADOPTION

Ordinance No. 2024-17 is hereby adopted as follows:

### Section 1: Outside-Village sewer service requirements.

- (a) This section applies to any retail sewer service provided and requested to be provided by the Village to premises that are located, in whole or in part, outside the municipal limits of the Village.
- (b) All customers of the Village's sewer system, including those customers located in whole or in part outside the municipal limits of the Village, shall comply with any cross-contamination and backflow prevention requirements of the Village or retail water service provider.
- (c) Any customer receiving utility services outside the Village municipal limits may not maintain connection to the Village's sewer system or connect to the Village's sewer system unless the customer is in compliance with the applicable Village ordinances. Customers receiving sewer service must at all times be in compliance with state law, the Village's plumbing code, the Village's pretreatment requirements, and this and other Village ordinances relating to the provision of sewer service. Any customer failing to be in compliance or refusing reasonable requests for inspection of facilities connected or to be connected to the Village's utilities may be disconnected or declined services.
- (d) The application for service to property located outside the corporate limits of the Village shall include the following statement:

THE APPLICANT UNDERSTANDS AND AGREES THAT ALL ORDINANCES OF THE VILLAGE (AS NOW WRITTEN AND AS HEREINAFTER AMENDED) RELATING TO SEWER SERVICE OR TO PLUMBING MATTERS, INCLUDING BUT NOT LIMITED TO CROSS-CONNECTION AND BACK-FLOW PROTECTION REQUIREMENTS, AND PRETREATMENT REQUIREMENTS, AND INCLUDING ORDINANCES THAT IMPOSE CRIMINAL SANCTIONS, APPLY TO SEWER SERVICES PROVIDED BY THE VILLAGE TO PREMISES OUTSIDE OF THE MUNICIPAL LIMITS. THE APPLICANT ALSO UNDERSTANDS AND AGREES THAT THE VILLAGE MAY SUSPEND OR DISCONNECT SUCH SERVICES IN THE EVENT THAT THE APPLICANT OR ANY OTHER PERSON AT THE PREMISES TO BE SERVED FAILS TO COMPLY WITH SUCH ORDINANCE.

THE APPLICANT ALSO UNDERSTANDS THAT THE APPLICANT'S PROPERTY CONNECTED TO THE VILLAGE'S SEWER SYSTEM WILL BE VOLUNTARILY ANNEXED BY THE VILLAGE AT SUCH TIME THAT IT IS LEGALLY POSSIBLE FOR THE VILLAGE TO ANNEX THE PROPERTY AND WHEN THE BOARD OF ALDERMEN DETERMINES IT TO BE IN THE BEST INTEREST OF THE VILLAGE.

- (e) No sewer service application shall be accepted by the Village and no new retail d sewer service shall be provided at premises located in whole or part outside the municipal limits of the Village unless a completed and signed application is submitted to the Village that meets the Village's sewer service application requirements, and the person has complied with the following requirements:
- (1) The person has paid the prescribed sewer connection and plumbing code inspection fees and impact fees if applicable, and has presented to the Village Administrator, or his or her designee, written evidence from the appropriate plumbing official that the plumbing system at the premises to be served has been inspected by the Village and is in compliance with the Village's plumbing code;
- (2) The person has complied with the Village's utility facilities extension requirements, if necessary; and
- (3) The person has submitted a written request to be annexed into the municipal limits of the Village. If the person's property is not contiguous to the municipal limits of the Village, the written request must be submitted, but will not be effective, until such time as the person's property is contiguous to the municipal limits of the Village. Such request shall be filed in the deed records and shall run with the land.
- (f) Only applicants located outside the municipal limits that meet the requirement of this section will be qualified service applicants and thus eligible to obtain sewer service.

**WHEREAS**, the Board has determined that it is in the best interest of the citizens of the Village to amend Ordinance 2019-15 as follows.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF ALDERMEN OF THE VILLAGE OF SALADO, TEXAS:

### SECTION I. ENACTMENT PROVISIONS

**A. Findings of Fact:** All of the above premises are hereby found to be true and correct legislative and factual findings of the Village of Salado and are hereby approved and incorporated into the body of this ordinance as if copied in their entirety.

- **B. Popular Name:** This Ordinance shall be commonly referred to as "The Building Permit and Inspection Fees Ordinance"
- **C. Scope:** This Ordinance, and the rules and regulations adopted herein, shall apply generally within the Village limits.
- **D. Effective Date:** This Ordinance shall take effect immediately upon passage and publication.

### SECTION II. ADOPTION

Ordinance No. 2024-18 is hereby adopted as follows:

- **Section 1.** The foregoing recitals are incorporated into this Ordinance by reference as findings of fact as if expressly set forth herein.
- **Section 2.** Ordinance No. 2019-15 is amended by removing Appendix A of Ordinance 2019-15 in its entirety and replacing it with Attachment "A" attached hereto, and incorporated herein as if fully set forth for all purposes.
- **Section 3**. This Ordinance shall become effective upon passage.
- **Section 4**. All rights and remedies of the Village are expressly saved as to any and all violations of the provisions of any previous ordinances which have accrued at the time of the effective date of this Ordinance; and, to such accrued violations and all pending litigation, both civil and criminal, whether pending in court or not, under such ordinances, same shall not be affected by this Ordinance but may be prosecuted until final disposition by the courts.

### SECTION III. SAVINGS CLAUSE

The repeal of any ordinance or part of ordinances effectuated by the enactment of this ordinance shall not be construed as abandoning any action now pending under or by virtue of such ordinance or as discontinuing, abating, modifying, or altering any penalty accruing or to accrue, or as affecting any rights of the Village under any section or provisions of any ordinances at the time of passage of this ordinance.

### SECTION IV. SEVERABILITY CLAUSE

If any provision, section, sentence, clause or phrase of this Ordinance, or the application of the same to any person or set of circumstances is for any reason held to be unconstitutional, void, invalid, or unenforceable, the validity of the remaining portions of this Ordinance or its application to other persons or sets of circumstances shall not be affected thereby, it being the intent of the Board of Aldermen of the Village of Salado in adopting, and of the Mayor in approving this Ordinance, that no portion thereof or provision or regulation contained herein shall be come

inoperative or fail by reason of any unconstitutionality or invalidity of any portion, provision or regulation.

### SECTION V. REPEALER CLAUSE

The provisions of this ordinance shall be cumulative of all other ordinances or parts of ordinances governing or regulating the same subject matter as that covered herein, provided, however, that all prior ordinances or parts of ordinances inconsistent or in conflict with any of the provisions of this ordinance are hereby expressly repealed to the extent that such inconsistency is apparent. This Ordinance shall not be construed to require or allow any act which is prohibited by any other Ordinance.

### SECTION VI. EFFECTIVE DATE

This Ordinance shall take effect immediately from and after its passage and publication as may be required by governing law.

### SECTION VII. NOTICE AND MEETING CLAUSE

It is hereby officially found and determined that the meeting at which this Ordinance was passed was open to the public and that public notice of the time, place, and purpose of said meeting was given as required by the Texas Open Meetings Act, Chapter 551 of the Texas Government Code.
